Equity Analyst's Bottom Line:

The "Issuer Not Cooperating" status is a **Red Flag**. For an equity holder, this represents a total loss of visibility. In a macro environment where ICRA projects **WPI to hit 4.8%** and **CAD to hit 1.7%**, companies failing to cooperate with rating agencies are likely the first to succumb to interest rate volatility or liquidity crunches. **Avoid Pranee Infrastructure; monitor energy-sensitive margins across the sector.**
